Abiding in Christ

John 15:1-11 (pew Bible p. 1071)

THE LORD'S SUPPER

Acclamation

Christ's Words of Institution — 1 Corinthians 11:23-27

On the night when He was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Prayer of Thanksgiving and Consecration

Lift up your hearts, Church.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right for us to give thanks and praise.

With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you created heaven and earth, made us in your image, and kept covenant with us — even when we fell into sin.

We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, who by his life, death, and resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

The bread that we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.

We who are many are one body, for we all share the same loaf.

The cup for which we give thanks is a sharing in the blood of Christ.

The cup that we drink is our participation in the blood of Christ.

And now, Father, by the power of the Holy Spirit who dwells within us and moves among us, seal this to our hearts as we eat the bread, representative of our Lord's body broken for us, and as we drink the cup, representative of His blood shed for the forgiveness of our sins.

In thanks for the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, in the joy of his resurrection, in the hope of his coming again, we come to the table of our Lord. Amen.
